Putting the point and **evidence** together:

## Next Stage – the explanation or analysis

The first way the poet presents contrast is between eating places. First, the poet looks at the expensive restaurant for whites. Inside is described:

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While the whites are being spoiled, and are indulging themselves in their own cuisine, black's have their “working man's café”. Customers “wipe your fingers on your jeans, spit a little on the floor”. The words “white”, “linen” and “rose” give the reader a picture of a more classy restaurant whereas the description of the café gives the impression that it's a much poorer street stall.

## Next Stage – the explanation or analysis

In the poem there are words that the poet uses to show his feelings. Words like “hot” and “white”. Both of these words are related to something burning. Since white can mean a really hot fire. Because these words are related to something hot, it can be inferred as anger. The poet also uses the words, “burn” and “bomb”. These words are things that people act on due to anger. This shows how bitter the poet is, to want to bomb and burn something down.

It is quite obvious that the poet has negative views on this matter that nothing has changed. He deliberately uses words like “trodden on”, “brash”, “crushed”, “small mean o” to express his feelings while continuing the flow of the stanzas. **His negative description creates the tone of the poem. His sarcasm is reflected after stanza three “No sign says it is: but we know where we belong”.** The poem is gloomy overall but raging with anger throughout. He somehow gets the reader to empathise with his perspective by his word choice.
